Rotary Club of Picton's Night of 1000 Dinners

Night of 1000 Dinners is an event to raised awareness of the destruction and injuries caused by landmines years after peace treaties have been signed. Funds are raised to help clear landmines and to help landmine survivors in war stricken counties.

Rotary of Picton Club's International Committee organized an evening of fun and fellowship in support of the Canadian Landmine Foundation. The guest speaker for this event was one of Canada's leading portrait photographers, V. Tony Hauser from Toronto. Tony is a photographer who has travelled to Cambodia to document 16 innocent children affected by unnecessary landmine incidents. "Living With Landmines" is the photo exhibition produced in collaboration with the Hon. Lloyd Axworthy, president of the University of Winnipeg. Two complete sets of this powerful exhibit are simultaneously touring universities across Canada and to date the life size images have been on display in 17 universities in 8 provinces. Tony Hauser shared his experiences in Cambodia and presented the Rotarians and guests with a power point presentation of the complete exhibition.
